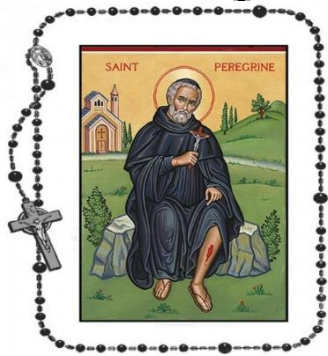


Saint Peregrine Laziosi Chaplet Prayer

The Saint Peregrine chaplet is made his medal centerpiece and 3 sets of 7 beads (21 beads).

Feast Day: May 1

Patronages: Against Cancer; Against Open Sores; Against Skin Diseases; AIDS Patients; Sick People

On the Medal Pray

O God, who gave to Saint Peregrine an angel for his companion, the Mother of God for his teacher, and Jesus as the physician of his malady, grant we beseech You through his merits that we may on Earth intensely love our holy angel, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and our Savior, and in Him bless them forever. Grant that we may receive the favor which we now petition. We ask this through the same Christ our Lord. Amen.

Pray the Our Father on each of the first seven beads, followed by the Saint Peregrine Invocation

Saint Peregrine Invocation: Holy Saint Peregrine, pray for us.

Pray the Hail Mary on each of the next seven beads, followed by the Saint Peregrine Invocation

Pray the Glory Be on the final set of seven beads, followed by the Saint Peregrine Invocation

Who is St. Peregrine?

Peregrine Laziosi was born of a wealthy family at Forli, Italy, in 1260. As a youth he was active in politics as a member of the anti-papal party. During one uprising, which the Pope sent Saint Philip Benizi to mediate, Philip was struck in the face by Peregrine. When Philip offered the other cheek, Peregrine was so overcome that he repented and converted to Catholicism.

Following the instructions of the Virgin Mary received in a vision, Peregrine went to Siena and joined the Servites. It is believed that, as a form of self-imposed penance, he never allowed himself to sit down for thirty years, while as far as possible also observing silence and solitude.

Sometime later, Peregrine was sent to Forli to found a new house of the Servite Order. An ideal priest, he had a reputation for fervent preaching and being a good confessor. When he was afflicted with cancer of the foot, and amputation had been decided upon, he spent the night before the operation in prayer. The following morning he was completely cured. This miracle caused his reputation to become widespread. He died in 1345 at the age of eighty-five, and he was canonized by Pope Benedict XIII in 1726.
